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VOCATIONAL GUIDANCE



Means the assistance given to an individual in solving problems related to occupational choice and progress regarding the individual's characteristics and their relation to occupational opportunity.

In our school responsible for the vocational guidance is the School Counsellor under Counselling and Employment Service of the Ministry of Education and Culture.

Every school has at least 2 days per week a counsellor. The amount of days of the Counsellor in a school is calculated from the number of students attending school.

SCHOOL COUNSELLING AND EMPLOYMENT SERVICE

The purpose of the SCES is to provide assistance in taking rational, personal, educational and professional decisions.

The main objectives of the counselling are the following:

1. Developmental

Aiming at human development such as self-awareness , self-esteem, employment decision and the transition from one step to another

2. Information, through education - teaching, lectures, etc.

3. Managing oneself and developing important interpersonal relationships





COUNSELLOR DUTIES REGARDING VOCATIONAL TRAINING

- Through personal interview, the pupil is supported and assisted for as many times as needed to learn and to make appropriate decisions for himself / herself.
- Through the coordinated meetings with the pupils, reference is also made on issues of self-awareness so that they realize how important it is to know himself / herself before making a decision.
- Through group training sessions, learning how to process and finalize their decision.
- Through team meetings with pupils, education system (Post - Secondary and Technical Schools) presentations are made to the pupils involved.
- Through the psychometric tools and questionnaires, an initial professional placement is made regarding of the pupils choices.

HOW THE STUDENTS ARE EVALUATED



Interview

The pupil can meet with one Professor or School Counsellor at the school or local offices and can discuss the interests, needs, values and everything that has been mentioned above. The interview is the main tool for each counsellor.

Test

Each counsellor can, on his / her own, perform an interest test (Strong Interest Inventory) or a personality test based on the Myers-Briggs Type Indicator, which will undoubtedly help in raising awareness on his or her interests and preferences. It can also complete a questionnaire about professional or business decision making difficulties and help them to distinguish the kind of information that looks more appropriate on the choices that he/she can make.

HOW THE STUDENTS ARE EVALUATED

Creative exercises

With the Professor / Counsellor, the pupil can participate in creative exploration exercises that will help in the examination of values, beliefs, etc. Exercises can find in the books of the Counselling and Vocational Education Service that exist in all Counselling Offices. Once the counsellor gathers this information, then they examine career options that match their profile.



PROFESSIONS SEMINARS

Every year the Counselling and Employment Service organise a “Professions day” that various profession profiles are presented and discussed.



PROFESSIONAL KNOWLEDGE TEST

Each pupil can book an appointment at the Counselling and Employment Department at the Ministry of Education and Culture and take a career test.

This test depends on the pupils answers and creates a pattern of the possible career paths that the pupil could consider as options based on their test selections.
